

INFORMATION:

On 26 December 2004, a devastating earthquake and tsunami destroyed the coasts of Aceh, Indonesia. Half a year later, on 15 August 2005, a peace agreement ended an armed separatist conflict that had held the province in its grip for almost three decades. In the past decade, Indonesia's westernmost province has gone through major changes related to post-disaster reconstruction efforts and post-conflict peacebuilding processes, as well as to Aceh's far-reaching political autonomy and the much-debated implementation of Islamic law. Where is Aceh heading, ten years after? What are the successes and failures of the reconstruction and peace-building processes? How has the huge foreign presence in the immediate post-disaster years influenced local politics and how is Aceh faring now that humanitarian organizations have moved elsewhere?

These questions will be addressed by a panel of specialists with extensive experience in Aceh. Their short presentations will be followed by a public discussion on Aceh's recent developments and future outlook.

David Kloos, postdoctoral researcher at the KITLV. He has carried out historical and anthropological research on Islam in Aceh (2008–2012).

Annemarie Samuels, postdoctoral researcher at the University of Amsterdam. She has carried out ethnographic research in Aceh on the post-tsunami recovery process and HIV/AIDS care.
